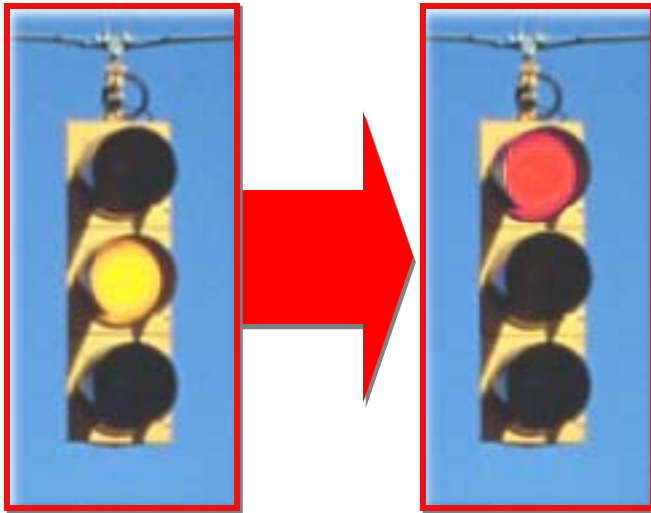

Situational Awareness



- **Understand the norm and recognize variations.**
- **Make awareness a *conscious* process.**
- **Pay attention to the potential terrorism cues.**

Incident Response: What To Do

Secure the site:

Get out.

Isolate the hazard:

Don't let others in.

Notify authorities:

Get help.

Incident Response

Stay calm!

Direct movement to the nearest exit(s) away from the incident.

Move everyone to a safe location:

- **Away from the incident site.**
- **Clear of response vehicles and equipment.**

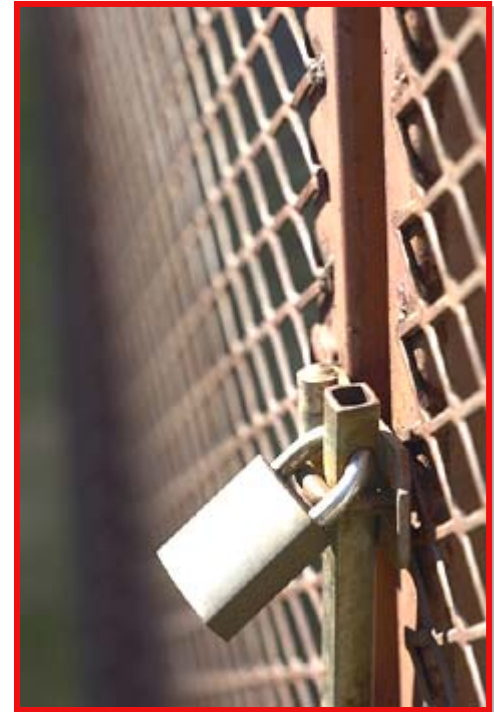
Securing the Site

Establish a control perimeter:

- Close off contaminated area by closing doors or blocking off entry.

Deny entry:

- Warn people to stay away.
 - Ask witnesses to remain available.
 - Move people away from a bomb.
- Do not move a bomb or other hazardous items away from people.**

Isolating the Hazard



Minimize Exposure Time

- **Avoid contact with suspect materials.**
- **Leave hazard area as fast as you can.**
- **Remove hazardous substances from your body.**

Notification

- **Notify authorities as quickly as possible.**
- **Follow local procedures.**
- **Be alert and observant.**
- **Be prepared to relay incident observations to responders.**
- **Remain available to report observations.**
