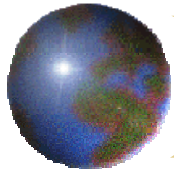


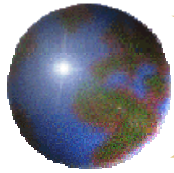

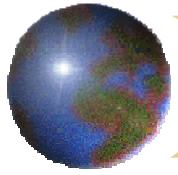
CUSTOMS AND BORDER PROTECTION (CBP)

- U.S. Customs and Border Protection is the unified border agency within the Department of Homeland Security.
- CBP combines the inspectional workforces and broad border authorities of U.S. Customs, U.S. Immigration, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Air and Marine Division and the entire U.S. Border Patrol.
- CBP includes more than 41,000 employees to manage, control and protect the United States' borders at and between the official ports of entry.



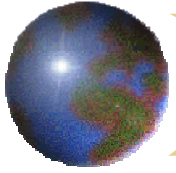
PROGRAMMATIC AIMS

- Improved border management in other countries secures more components of the supply chain and protects the trade network from misuse.
- Extends our nations borders to maximize our nonproliferation efforts
- To assist other nations in meeting or exceeding WCO framework standards.
- To address the global nature of the border security threat.



PRE-PROGRAM TECHNICAL EXCHANGES

- International Visitors Program (IVP) – consists of specially arranged briefings and visits to CBP operations in the United States by foreign high level customs and other law enforcement officials who perform or manage functions similar to those encompassed within CBP's area of responsibility and expertise.
- Assessments – are intended to provide important information that will assist the CBP advisor in country and CBP headquarters personnel to determine what training and/or equipment deliveries are required to improve and enhance operations.



NON-PROLIFERATION OF WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION

- These various training courses are designed to provide awareness of WMD threats entering/exiting or transiting the host country, and to provide appropriate practical exercises to assist in identifying and interdicting WMD.
- These courses combine WMD experts from CBP Laboratories and Scientific Services (LSS), U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) with the interdiction and investigation techniques of CBP officers, customs agents and Border Patrol personnel. Training courses include:
 - Enforcement training relating to land border and seaports, rail, and air, as well as other courses pertaining to border control.
